




# Zaldibia in figures




Zaldibia is located in the centre of the Basque Country, in the area of Goierri, in Gipuzkoa province. We live at the foot of the Aralar mountains and beside the streams of Amundarain and Urtsubi.


Built-up and country areas rub shoulders in the municipal area. While most of the population lives in the village itself, there are numerous farms in the surrounding country area, grouped into localities including Elbarrena, Arruegi, Urreta, Urtsu-Erreka, Olaeta, Egilegor, Aiestaran-Erreka and Urtesabel.

There are currently 1,630 inhabitants, with an upward trend in recent years. Zaldibia covers an area of 16.2 km<sup>2</sup>, with 97.9 inhabitants per km<sup>2</sup> (2019).




The age and gender profile of the village:






With regard to the place of birth of the Zaldibitarras, the people of Zaldibia, these are the figures:

# **FEBRUARY**

SANTA ÁGUEDA'S EVE: 'Coplas' sung around the houses.



CARNIVAL: Children dress up for carnival and put on a show.



# **MARCH**

INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY: 8th March, organised by the women of the village and the Aske group.



# **APRIL**

ABERRI EGUNA: Basque national day, celebrated on Easter Monday.



FIESTA DE SATURDI: Celebrated on Easter Monday around the chapel of San Saturnino (Saturdi), in the locality of Urreta.



KORRIKA: Public Basque language initiative organised village by village by AEK every two years.



DANTZARI TXIKI: All-day event organised every year by the Iztueta dance group in March/ April, inviting local children's dance groups.





# MAY

INTERNATIONAL WORKERS' DAY: 1st May.



**OPENING OF ARALAR PASTURES:** 1st May. Stock-breeding event in Larraitz.



BASERRITARRA DAY: 15th May; the farmers of the village meet for a meal.



# **JUNE**

End of year parties at the school and other extra-curricular services.



BONFIRE FESTIVITY: 23rd June. The summer solstice is celebrated around the bonfire known as "Alamartxo".



JULY ZALDIBIAKO GAZTE FESTAK: Festivities organised by the Zaldibia youth group.



**SUMMER ACTIVITIES:** Programme of activities for children aged between 2 and 14.





TXAMARRETXE LOCAL FESTIVITIES: Organised by the residents of this locality in the upper part of the village.

PENSIONERS' DAY: Part of the programme of activities of the Beti Gazte association.



# **OCTOBER**

ZALDIBIA FESTIVITIES: Main village festivities. Celebrated around Santa Fe's day (6th October).





ARDIKI DAY: Following the local sheep farming tradition, competitions and stalls pay homage to sheep and local mondeju sausages. Organised by the Ardiki association.



# **NOVEMBER**

INTERNATIONAL DAY FOR THE ELIMINATION OF VIO-LENCE AGAINST WOMEN: 25th November.





# **DECEMBER**

BASQUE LANGUAGE DAY: 3rd December, International Basque Language Day. Basque is the principal language in everyday life in our village.



WINTER SOLSTICE: With the arrival of winter, the people of Zaldibia go singing house to house and celebrate the arrival of the Olentzero, a figure from Basque folklore. Activities are also organised to celebrate the start of the new year.







# Zaldibia and our values

# I. DEMOCRACY AND PARTICIPATION:

Municipal elections are held every four years and the council is formed according to the results of voting, with nine councillors from different political parties or groups. The municipal representatives hold plenary sessions to decide on a range of matters.

To discuss these matters beforehand, committee and work area and/or public meetings are held. The committees are made up of members of the public, municipal representatives and experts from each department. To take part in them, you should answer the invitations, contact the people responsible for the departments or sign up at the town hall.

The membership of committees may vary, but in general their structure is the same every year.

#### URBANISH COMMITTEE

A place for debate and decision-making about urban planing and the village surroundings.

# CULTURE, BASQUE AND SPORTS COMMITTEE

Committee for areas like culture, Basque, sport and festivities to be run by an open, public organisation and also to come up with new challenges.

# ENVIRONMENT, RURAL DEVELOPMENT AND PRIMARY SECTOR DEPARTMENT

Department devoted to the primary sector, forestry and mountains, rural development and environmental conservation.

# EQUALITY, EDUCATION, YOUTH AND DIVERSITY DEPARTMENT

Department that works to build a village in which education, youth and cultural diversity play a central role. Hence this welcome guide you are looking at.

# WORKS, SERVICES AND WELFARE DEPARTMENT

Department to help overcome problems of whatever kind that arise in everyday life in order to protect public welfare. The town hall uses different means to communicate with the public: mailshots, notices in doorways, municipal noticeboards in the street, the Attention to the Public office, the municipal website (www.zaldibia.eus), Itturritik magazine, the municipal app (ZaldibiAPP) and the WhatsApp information channel.

The council works to broaden and deepen the sphere of public participation. Apart from participation being a public right and a duty of public bodies, the people of Zaldibia understand that it is also a tool and a way to help meet society's needs by systematically listening and responding both ways. This strengthens our feeling of belonging to Zaldibia.

# III. BASQUE-SPEAKING **ZALDIBIA**

The most widely-used first language in our village is Basque. Moreover, Zaldibia, together with another 85 Basque towns and villages, is part of UEMA, the association of Basquespeaking municipalities, and pursues actions and policies to promote and foster the use of our language.

The Basque language lives on in Zaldibia. It is used at home, in the street, at work and at play, and we are striving to keep it that way. In the face of the repression Basque has suffered, we have the challenge of not reinforcing the dominant languages, with the aim of carrying our relations in our language while welcoming those who do not speak it and offering them ways and assistance to learn it.







# IV. ZALDIBIA: EQUALITY IN DIVERSITY

Zaldibia is a village that believes in diversity and equality; however different we are to one another, we all have the same rights and freedoms, as well as duties. We back equal opportunities and treatment based on diversity and respect, to live as a community and confront oppressive systems.

Thus, over the year a range of activities are run, taking advantage of international days for different causes, with the aim of living in this way in our everyday lives.







# V. ZALDIBIA, THE VILLAGE THAT CARES FOR ITS ENVIRONMENT

Zaldibia is a village lying among mountains and streams, which has always been closely linked to nature, both for farming and for leisure.

Loving our land and our surroundings, caring for the parts of which they are made up and acting responsibly is a value to pass on from generation to generation.

The policies pursued in recent decades have led to a climate emergency, making it essential to make human and local development fit in with the environment.











# VI. ZALDIBIA AND COMMUNITY WORK: KEEPING UP WHAT'S OURS

Community work is one of the roots of the culture of the Basque Country. This is what we do for our neighbours, neighbourhood or village, and it has been passed on from generation to generation. Whether it is maintaining the local street, building something of use to everybody or organising a celebration.

Agreeing on the goal and putting in the time and abilities each of us has to offer. Whether directly or indirectly, we are working in this direction, through appeals to help on specific dates or by encouraging and supporting the work done by the people in different local groups.

As well as telling new arrivals how much we value community work, we want to tell you about the positive effects this can have on all of you: community work will help you become part of the village and help you to feel part of it, as well as giving you a unique opportunity to get to know people and the village itself..









# VII. ZALDIBIA, WORKING TO BECOME AN EDUCATIONAL VILLAGE

The educational village is a model that includes everybody, starting out from the reality of the smallest members of the community.

An educational village is based on recognising children's culture of play and creativity as specific learning and development tools. It is also based on recognising children's real ability to take part and make decisions; doing this through educational fun in Basque, constructed by them as equals in diversity while caring for the environment, the community network, fostering teamwork and forging healthy, fair and satisfying relationships between people.

The council meeting of 6th March 2020 approved an agreement with Oinherri, the network of educational villages. The project has been under way since then, its doors open to anybody who wants to join in.











# **Endpiece**

Caring for and respecting ourselves, each other and our environment. This is an essential requirement for living together and mutual respect, understanding and care. To live together well it is essential to follow the rules laid down in the village, as this is their function and their goal.

We are a village based on diversity. Individual freedom ends where other people's freedom begins, so Zaldibia does not accept sexist, homophobic or racist aggression or attitudes that harm our coexistence.


This is why new arrivals from all corners of the world are welcome in Zaldibia. We want them to become a part of our village, to build a diverse, colourful Basque Country.
